GCSE / AS / A level assessments

A lot of information about the assessment processes for these has been published today. We will base our plans on these documents and communicate the assessment processes to you and pupils over the coming weeks. The pupils will have the opportunity to receive initial grades during June before receiving their final grades in early August.

Welfare and Catch Up Day

Thursday will be a day for pupils to have a chance to catch up. This will be a good opportunity for Year 10-13 pupils to prepare for returning to school. There will be no live lessons on the day and staff will be preparing to return to school.

LFT tests for pupils
